## ASSISTANCE FOR AIR CREW TRAINING

## Question No. 726-Mr. Dinsdale:

- 1. Is air crew training for pilots, radio operators and navigators assisted under the vocational and technical training program?
- 2. Are student loans available for air crew training?
- 3. What other programs are available or contemplated to meet the chronic shortage of air crew personnel?

Hon. Judy V. LaMarsh (Secretary of State): I am informed by the Departments of Manpower and Immigration, Finance and Transport as follows:

- 1. Under the occupational training for adults program required educational upgrading and related skill courses may be purchased. Flying time in aircraft has not been purchased.

- 3. Assistance is now provided in the form of a grant of two hundred dollars equally divided between the school and the pilot for private pilot training. The Department of Transport is presently studying possible methods of financial aid to assist commercial pilots improve their flying qualifications. The studies in this regard have not yet been completed.

- Mr. J. A. Byrne (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of Transport): 1. Since March 25, 1965, there have been seven capital assistance grants aproved for airport improvements in Ontario. The following list indicates the municipalities for which the assistance grants have been aproved and the amount of the grant. Elliot Lake, \$230,000.00; Midland, \$38,070,00; Niagara district (passenger-operations bldg.), \$41,985.00; Peterborough, \$596,000.00; Sarnia (passenger-operations bldg.), \$30,562.50; South Porcupine (seaplane base), \$26,920.00; Waterloo-Wellington, \$374,000.00.
- 2. The following amounts have been paid on the grants. Elliot Lake, \$779.52; Niagara district, \$22,610.76; Peterborough, \$149,276.27; South Porcupine, \$26,920.00; Waterloo-Wellington, \$369,709.52.
