Mr. J. M. Forrestall (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of Transport): Mr. Speaker, the purpose of Bill C-88, the short title of which is the Marine Atlantic Inc. Acquisition Authorization Act, is to establish CN Marine as a separate Crown corporation under a new name, Marine Atlantic Inc. This
