CROP INSURANCE ACT

MEASURE TO AMEND

Hon. Doug Lewis (for the Minister of Agriculture) moved that Bill C-48, an act to amend the Crop Insurance Act, be read the second time and referred to a legislative committee.

Mr. Murray Cardiff (Parliamentary Secretary to Deputy Prime Minister, President of the Privy Council and Minister of Agriculture): Madam Speaker, I am very pleased to present to the House for second reading Bill C-48, which is legislation amending the Crop Insurance Act.

This new legislation amending the Crop Insurance Act is crucial to protect Canadian farmers from economic losses due to uncontrollable natural hazards such as drought, hail, and waterfowl, and many other elements of weather that are uncontrollable by man. Without that protection farmers can face extreme financial hardships. Such risks and disasters are unacceptable for individual producers and our agricultural crop industry in general.
