L. J.L. Regan June 5-22 situated and from inquiries made I think it to be suitable in every respect. Next Winter is likely to produce a situation as bad as the past one was and I think that the Association must be kept alive to deal with it. To de this Charles should be kept on the job planning ways and means, looking for employment for men and arranging accommodation for the early Winter. He may think it necessary to retain some of his staff and I would accept any recommendation he makes in this regard. Any of the staff whose services are dispensed with, should in all fairness be generously treated. They should be given a cheque for at least one month's wages. I think that Charles deserves some recognition for the work he has done and that I recommend that his salary be increased vy \$50.00 per month and that be antedated to March 1st, the time at which this Board took over. My resignation will leave two vacancies on the Board. I strongly recommend that these be filled at once. Sir Arthur Currie is greatly interested in the work and he is certainly the most logical, as well as the strongest man the Association could have on the Board. I recommend that he be asked to act, and that should he find it impossble to do so, he be
