LETTER TO COLONEL MACKENZIE FRASER.

TORONTO, 4th August, 1840.

Sir,

Major Magrath having denied on several occasions, and particularly at a Meeting of the Stewards of this year, (Colonel Airey in the Chair) held in the Ontario House on the 24th ultimo, receiving from you the sum of £28 7s. 6d. Currency, being the balance of race monies of June Meeting 1839, which remained in the Farmer's Bank here at your credit.

I have therefore the honor to request, as Secretary to these races, and Member of the Committee of Finance for that meeting, that you will be pleased to furnish me with a certified copy of any voucher you may be possessed of from Major Magrath for the money in question.
