United States Sends Forecasts.

In 1852 the militia turned over the Toronto Observatory to the colonial government and in 1855 a new building had been erected. It was in 1870, when the observatory work was under the late Professor Kingston, that the storm signal service was introduced in Canada, for which purpose the government made a grant of \$5000. This was followed by the establishment of a few storm signal stations on the great lakes, and an exchange of reports was made with the weather bureau at Washington, which also had at that time a few storm signal stations thruout the United States. When Washington knew of a storm heading for the great lakes, word was sent from that great lakes, word was sent from that city to Toronto and from Toronto

to the storm signal stations.

Newfoundland Threatened.
