VETERAN GEERS LANDS ANVIL WINNER M. & M.

Feature Race at Detroit Decided in Straight Heats—Second Being a Whipping Finish.

DETROIT, Aug. 4.—Rain caused a further postponement at the Grand Circuit races to-day, and the long race in the afternoon.

Duplicating his feat with Duddy Archdale last year, the veteran to-day piloted Anvil to a straight heat victory.

The high speed started strictly up to his measurable reputation, breaking disgracefully just when he seemed to be going at his best.

A real contest was the 2nd renewal of the classic M. & M. for 124 class trotters.

Breaking before the first turn, Anvil reached in the first heat, but lost a dozen or more lengths before catching his feet.

The third heat was easy, the Geers horse leading all the way, with the driver looking back as they jostled to the wire.

The 2nd race produced the best racing of the meet. Walter W. led to the head of the stretch in the first heat with Earl Jr. and Alcyras racing the 2nd heat.
