

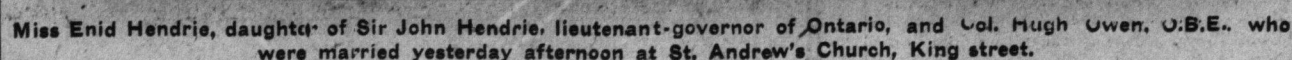

## GERMANY SUFFERING FROM LACK OF COAL

---

Indicated by Quality of the Exhibits at Leipzig Fair.

London, Oct. 8.—Reports reaching this city from Germany relative to the Leipzig fair throw light on Germany's economic position. According to the secretary of the exhibition, there were 7,000 foreign buyers present.

Conversations with exhibitors gave me the impression that many German industries were near bankruptcy, owing to the shortage of coal and the loss of export trade, their only hope being to trade with neutrals and America. Fear was expressed that the continued hostility of the British would prevent trade in England. Exhibitors at the fair seemed to show that manufacturers are not depending upon foreign raw materials but rather

Prague, Oct. 8. — The Versailles treaty with Germany came before the Czecho-Slovak parliament for ratification at a session next week. Debate on ratification will be followed by a discussion of the general lines of foreign policy for the new republic. On the subject Foreign Minister Benes made an introductory statement last week.
