PENSION FOR BANK EMPLOYEES

Bank of Hamilton Directors Will Propose Fund for Consideration.

The 35th annual report of the Bank of Hamilton for the year ended Nov. 30 shows that the balance at credit of profit and loss account, Nov. 30, 1905, was \$25,410.85; the profits for the year ended Nov. 30, 1906, after deducting charges of management and provision for bad and doubtful debts, are \$371,251.52; premium received on new stock was \$23,350; giving a total of \$450,012.35; from which have been paid four quarterly dividends, in all 10 per cent, of \$246,392.31; carried to reserve fund from premium on new stock as above, \$25,850; written off bank premises, \$25,000; carried to rebate of interest account, \$10,000; and to ex-president authorized by shareholders, or a total of \$315,742.31; leaving a balance of profit and loss carried forward of \$139,270.04.
