There is a great demand for houses to buy at \$4000 and under, especially in the western part of the city. Regarding house renting, those from \$20 to \$25 seem to be the average houses sought for but these are very limited in desirable localities. The prospects point to a good fall, and intending purchasers should not delay in deciding when suited, as next spring prices are sure to be higher. There are over 2000 families at present houseless, having their furniture stored, so that when these require houses prices will certainly advance, both in renting and selling.




