BACON SHIPMENTS AND HOG PRICES.

The Canadian hog market has, to appearances, reached a steady stage in prices at a level considered moderately remunerative to the raiser. It would be difficult to predict that an advance in quotations should take place, but two circumstances rather favor that idea. The unusual late and wet spring was injurious to successful raising of Without statistics of the visible supply in the farmers' hands, the general complaints of poor litters would indicate more or less scarcity later in the year. In the States calculations have been rudely disturbed, and the expected heavy receipts during the current month have been wanting. At Chicago the daily runs of hogs have turned out far below thosecounted on, and the falling off in receipts compared with those of a year ago amounts to nearly 30 per cent. Prices at all American points have advanced sharply, and are now 70c. a cwt. higher than those of a month ago. Exports of bacon to Great. Britain from the United States, from Jan. 1 to June 1 of the present year, were 1,311,724 cwts., against 1,260,441 cwts in 1903. Canadian exports were 206,508 cwts., against 180,825 for the same period. These figures are peculiar, inasmuch as, except for two weeks during the present year, the Canadian price for hogs has not been as high as that paid in the States, notwithstanding the fact that the Canadian hog is admitted to be superior to the American hog for bacon purposes. Viewed in the light of the present and recent condiilons, the weight of evidence is against any material decline in prices, and rather points to a firmer tone for the immediate future
