Advance for Drill Hall.

Rioting continued on Saturday night, when the element which appears to be organizing the disturbances made an act tempt to break into the drill hall at Grande Allee. The intention of the rioters was, it is rumored, to liberate draftees on duty there. The attempt failed, as the building was priected by a cordon of soldiers, who easily resisted the attacks, and, with the help of mounted troops, broke up the mob's organization. No shooting took place. The intentions of the mob leaders are indicated by a raid made upons the hardware store of Brousseau Feres in the early hours of Sunday morning. This fight's store is on St. Paul street, near the Canadian Pacific Railway depot, and away from the points that have been attacked so far. It was not being patrolled by the military. The store was broken into and reolvers and ammunition were removed.


