Returned Soldier Active in Securing Money for Overseas "Smokes."

Further subscriptions for "Canada's Tobacco Fund," are being secured by Pte. R. L. Whitehead, 128 York street, who while taking a course at the technical school here, is devoting his spare time to collecting funds to provide smokes for the boys in the trenches.

Pte. Whitehead, a member of the original 4th Battalion, first contingent, is the only authorized representative collecting for the fund in Western Ontario, and has received word from Francis R. Jones, organizing secretary of the fund for Canada, that his collections, added to those made through boxes in public buildings, will be thankfully received.

During his course at the school here Pte. Whitehead hopes to complete the canvass of the city, and also to do some of the outside territory.

Owing to the fact that the money is sent overseas and the tobacco purchased there, it is possible in this way to send 100 cigarettes to the boys in France for 25 cents. THE PAPER BOYS OF LONDON IN A STRAIGHT TALK TO CITIZENS

An Appeal Written by One of the Lads Who Carries the News of the World to Your Front Door.

Dear Folks,—I am a paper boy, and when I made my rounds today some of my customers told me that they would have to quit the paper because it was going to cost two cents more per week. But still these same people would pay from a quarter to two dollars to see a theatre play in wartime and consider it a good investment. Furthermore—and this I can vouch for—they have often kept their paper boy waiting for two and three weeks for his ten cents and have scolded him if he were late or the paper soiled in muddy or wet weather. You know that the paper boy has to pay for his papers weekly, and when careless customers keep him waiting two or three weeks for his dime he is losing money.

After April 1 your paper boy will have to pay more for his papers, and as a measure of self-preservation he will be forced to charge you more than formerly. Now remember that your paper boy has brought you your news through all kinds of weather, in freezing winter when it would be too cold for him to collect like that Saturday seven weeks ago, and in the hot summer, when you anxiously await your paper that you may enjoy the news of your swinging hammock or in the big easy chair on the side veranda. Please bear in mind that your paper boy is really making as much money as he did

three years ago, for the simple reason that a dollar won't buy as much now as it would then.

Now, if you are considering quitting your paper boy and taking the paper from the corner store in order to save two cents a week, just stop and think what a useful public servant the paper boy is and how well he has served you in the past. Then your better judgment will convince you that you're not a tightwad and that TWO CENTS a week either way will never make a break in your pocket. Besides, you will wear out expensive shoe leather to get bit by a dog or run over or catch cold, or something else equally serious. When you consider the matter, it is really worth twelve cents a week to have your newspaper placed in your letterbox within an hour after it has come from the press.

Now, folks, you know that the abnormal conditions of today are caused by the Kaiser, and that the war is caused by the Kaiser. I am quite sure if old Billie ever stuck his crooked Teutonic nose through your back fence that your paper boy would be the first one there with a good strong rope to hang him to a sour apple tree in the morning. 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CANADA FOOD BOARD RUNNING SLIPSHOD, DECLARES LAURIER

Battery of High-Salaried Officials Shows Few Results.

PRICES ARE NOT REDUCED

Order Reconstructing Board Does Not Define Chief's Duties.

OTTAWA, March 27.—A Government caucus, which was not a love feast, a scathing expose by the leader of the Opposition of the reckless waste and expenditure by the food control board, and a weak reply, and defense by the minister of trade and commerce, and the minister of agriculture, and the intrusion into the House by a member of the Government, the force of the controversial tariff issue—these formed the main features in the House yesterday afternoon.

It was said that the introduction of the tariff question in the House formed the main feature of the day's session. The Government's position was that the tariff question was not a proper subject for discussion in the House.
