Receipts were not generally quite so heavy on the wholesale fruit market yesterday.

Raspberries
 Raspberries brought from 15c to 25c per box, only a very small quantity going at either the 25c or the 15c, the bulk selling at 20c to 22c per box.

Strawberries
 Strawberries still came in small lots, and sold at 15c to 16c per box, the bulk going at 12c to 13c per box.

Cherries
 Cherries were scarce, the sweet ones being exceptionally so. Sour principally sold at 90c to \$1.10 per 11-quart basket, and 90c to 95c per six-quart, the few sweet ones selling at \$2.50 to \$2.75 per 11-quart basket, and \$1.25 to \$1.50 per six-quart.

Blueberries
 Blueberry shipments were heavy, the bulk selling at \$1 to \$1.75 per 11-quart basket, a very few exceptionally choice ones bringing \$2 per 11-quart basket.

Black Currants
 Black currants were shipped in very light quantities, and sold at \$1.50 to \$2 per 11-quart basket.

Apples
 The first Canadian apples for this season came in yesterday, but they were absolutely unfit for sale, they being so small and green.

Vegetable Marrow
 Vegetable marrow shipments increased materially, and they were a very slow sale, at 10c to 15c per 11-quart basket.

Tomatoes
 Tomatoes were also shipped in heavily and sold at \$1.25 to \$1.75 per 11-quart basket.

Cucumbers
 Cucumbers came in freely, and sold at 75c to \$1 per 11-quart basket, an odd one of extra choice quality bringing \$1.25.
