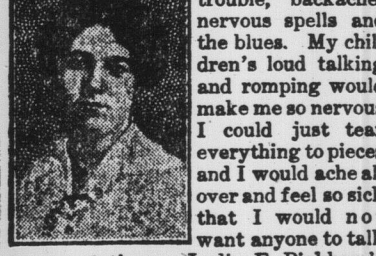

A Big Increase

For the eleven months ending February, 1917, the total value of domestic and foreign exports through this port reached the enormous total of \$19,264,844—an increase of \$7,942,254 over the whole of the previous fiscal year. St. John's imports during the last eleven months were \$18,702,455—a sum of \$2,582,095 greater than the imports during the fiscal year 1915-16.
