This product that is not eaten daily under some cover of preparation, so why should there be any prejudice towards a clean and wholesome product which has the endorsement of the best scientific authorities of the world, as to its healthful and useful benefit as a food.

In the United States the days of miscellaneous mixtures of dairy butter of varied qualities and age are past; for there are creameries established in almost every township. The output from these creameries is sold through the agency of the National Dairyman's Association, from whom the creamery company get their shipping instructions. The association collects a commission on the general output.

For some years I conducted a wholesale business near door to a Michigan creamery, to which the farmers brought milk daily. They would buy butterine for their family use, claiming that they could not afford to make butter, considering the price they were getting for their milk. In fact, the manager of the creamery bought it in original packages for his farm, as well as for his town house. Consumers are permitted to buy in original packages. Licensed retail dealers are required to sell from broken packages, the amount of a single sale being limited to ten pounds.

Good Butter Scarce
I fall to see where the prohibition of butterine is helping the Canadian farmer, nor do I see any fairness in the farmer holding up the public to enrich any association or incorporation in control of the market for creamery butter. Conditions in Canada have changed since this prohibitive law was enacted. The creameries are in control, the farmer is not. It is profitable to make butter, consequently the market is clean of cheap refuse stock, and if the people cannot afford to buy creamery they will have to do without.

It was only in recent years that the Canadian packer could realize more for his choice edible fats than their value for mechanical purposes, but today he has found the great markets of Rotterdam and Amsterdam, and is producing oleo oil, and neutral lard for export, and is sending away the very products which are most needed at home for our people, for our great lumber and mining camps, and for our armies.

This is a time when a more common sense view should be taken by our government regarding the use of butterine. Canada is the only country that I know of which maintains such a foolish and injurious law.
