(By Lillian Kenny, Institutional man-
ager, Chicago School of Domestic
Arts and Science.)
German Coffee Bread.

This delicious fancy bread, excel-
lent to serve for a change at break-
fast, luncheon or supper, will cost
only about nine cents a loaf, if the
flour is used in the family menu and
it is poor economy not to obtain it,
even at the cost of a few extra
pennies a week.

The ingredients are one cup of
milk, six tablespoons lard, two cups
sugar, half teaspoon salt, one egg,
one-third yeast cake, one-quarter
pound raisins, three tablespoons but-
ter, one-third cup of sugar, and three
cups of flour. Kneaded, mixed and
baked as usual this makes two loaves
of fancy bread.
