VENIOT SAYS PLAN WAS DEVISED BY HIM

Former Premier Speaks of Payments to Provinces by
C. N. R.

That the general plan under which it is expected the Canadian National Railways will pay into the provincial treasuries taxes on the corporation properties was devised by Hon. P. J. Veniot, the former premier said today in an interview with a Times-Star reporter.

Dr. Veniot said the negotiations were begun in 1924, when he was head of the New Brunswick Government, and that the following year there was a conference at Fredericton, the C. N. R. being represented by its chief counsel. The general principles of taxing the properties of the system were agreed on, although the amounts to go into the treasury of each province were not fixed, the final arrangement depending mainly on the mileage with the life of each province.

At the last session of the Legislature, Dr. Veniot said, he reminded Premier Baxter that C. N. R. taxes were available and that the Government should go after them.

Under the tentative agreement made with the Maritime provinces will receive \$250,000 annually, this province to get about \$75,000.
