CANADIAN GRAIN

*STOCKS LARGE

Returns collected by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics show that on March 31, 1921, the quantity of wheat in Canada was about 83,627,000 bushels, as compared with 77,000,000 bushels last year, 1920. The total for 1921 includes 83,627,000 bushels in elevators and flour mills, 6,608,000 bushels in transit either by rail or at United States Atlantic seaboard ports. The total quantity of crop correspondents show that of the total wheat production of 1920, 10 per cent, or 43,910,000 bushels, remained in farmers' hands on March 31, 1921. Last year the proportion was 18 per cent, representing 84,597,000 bushels. This year's surplus is larger than that for any year since 1917, when nearly 24,000,000 bushels were returned to farmers' hands on March 31.
