**INTERVIEW WITH SAINT JOHN MAN**  
**S. C. Young, in New York, Speaks on Canadian Matters.**  
An issue of the Pennsylvania Register, the daily publication of the State of Pennsylvania, New York, dated Nov. 24, contains the following of local interest:—  
Canada has found a substitute for American anthracite. Being dependent upon the United States for warmth in winter involves too many uncertainties to make for a comfortable state of mind, Sidney C. Young, a recent guest of Hotel Pennsylvania from St. John, N. B., is quoted as saying:—  
"We're using Welsh semi-anthracite," he said, "and we find it a very excellent substitute for the anthracite we have been getting from America. Wales has an illimitable supply, so it isn't hard to get, and it keeps us from being dependent upon the ups and downs of the coal situation in America."  
"Other advantages? There are several. For cooking it makes a quick, hot fire, just as soft coal does, but it is not dirty and it lasts longer. Of course, Canada has a great deal of coal herself, but it is mostly soft, and is unpleasant to burn extensively."  
In Canada, as in America, people are leaving the farm and going to the cities, Mr. Young said.  
"Canada needs agriculturists, and wants them. We are trying to encourage immigration from the Northern
