The International Congress of Working Women, which held sessions in Geneva, Switzerland, from Oct. 17 to 25, closed its proceedings after the adoption of a broad program dealing with social and economic crisis before the world today.

The disapproval resolution of the Congress was a pronouncement in favor of a policy of total disarmament, and the Congress urged the powers convening at Washington, Nov. 11th, to hold their deliberations in open session, and to take steps to bring about total disarmament.

The objects of the International Federation of Working Women, (new name adopted), are threefold: (1) to promote trade union organization among women; (2) to develop an international policy giving special consideration to the needs of working women on organizations affecting the welfare of the workers.

Only national trade union organizations who are either affiliated with the International Federation of Trade Unions (Amsterdam) or whose aims agree in the spirit to follow the principles of the Amsterdam Convention are eligible for membership in the organization.

The next point which arises is whether ex-Service men can be employed for this purpose. The following statement made by Sir Arthur Ross, President of the Board of Agriculture, in the House of Commons, August 10, 1921, leaves no doubt upon this matter:

"The total number of ex-Service men provisionally approved as 'suitable' for small holdings before December 1, 1920, and who had not yet been provided with holdings, is stated to be 14,858, and it is hoped that those who still desire holdings will be provided for in due course. Of these 12,000 ex-Service men, it will be noted, have been approved. They have been approved by the Board of Agriculture under conditions that are very exacting. They must possess the necessary capital and must be able to prove their capacity to cultivate a small holding. They have done so and they are still waiting and it appears from the latest declaration of the Government that they can either wait at home or say goodbye and try their luck elsewhere."
