The Legislature. To make room for the publication of the County accounts this week we are obliged to curtail our legislative report. Our readers do not miss very much, however, as the policy of the opposition appears to be to wait all the time possible and convey to disinterested outsiders the idea that the politics of the province—as far as Mr. Hanington and his followers can give them tone and direction in the Assembly—are run on the old town-meeting lines. All this effort of the government and its friends to have the business of the province conducted in a self-respecting and dignified manner seem to be futile, against the determination of Messrs. Hanington, Stockton, Atkinson and such gentlemen, who seem to be almost insane over the fact that the public business is not corruptly managed.

Another Bad Break. The St. John Globe, in an editorial on "personal journalism," says: "The Globe has endeavored to get the Sun to have 'some regard for professional courtesy and honor,' and it complains bitterly because the Sun has made personal reference to Mr. Ellis, editor of the Globe, and yet the Globe, which is a Liberal paper, allows an anonymous 'Conservative' writer to make use of its columns to assail the editor of the Advance. We presume that the Globe takes this method of revenging itself on the editor of the Advance as it does on other liberals who could not so far forget their duty to Canada as to support the unscrupulous and dishonest candidates in the last election. The Globe's editor does himself little credit in making the columns of his paper the vehicle of positive misstatements to the prejudice of other journalists. However, in his case, the old saying, Facit et deservit, seems to hold good. Once a paper like the Globe makes a bad break, it always has a tendency towards making worse ones. No one is now surprised at anything the Globe says or does.

Landlord's Responsibilities. A New York Herald cable despatch of 16th inst.— "A blue book issued by the government yesterday discloses the fact that 125 places in the realm are the owners of places in which intoxicating drinks are sold. The number of 'drink shops' owned by these persons is 1,539. The list is headed by the Earl of Derby, who, the blue book shows, is the owner of seventy-two drinking places. Next come the Duke of Bedford with forty-eight 'drink shops' to his credit, the Duke of Devonshire with thirty-seven, the Earl of Northumberland with thirty-four and the Duke of Portland with thirty-two. Included in this list is the Right Rev. Richard Lewis, D. D., Bishop of Llandaff, who, the blue book shows, is the owner of two places which are devoted to the sale of intoxicating liquors." It was once a reproach that Trinity and St. Andrew's churches, St. John, owned premises which were among the worst moral spots of that city. It may be so still, although it is probable the great fire purified them to a great extent. Such facts as disclosed by the blue book referred to by the Herald and in reference to those two churches, illustrate one of the many much-discussed moral responsibilities of landlords.

The Great Crown Land Reformer. Of all people writing for the papers, the class who seek to promote private ends and aims by playing the role of political reformers, Good Samaritans, scientists, sportsmen etc., are the greatest nuisances. Attention is directed to this class of pre-contributors by a four and a half column letter in the Sun from "Mr. Edward Jack, C. E.," with whose much-privileged case the readers of New Brunswick papers, and particularly those of that journal, are warmly familiar. The old gentleman, as many of us know, has spent much time in the woods, for he has love almost as strong as that of the aborigine, and largely for the same reason, viz., because it has enabled him to cultivate and gratify a nomadic taste, live a life of reclusive ease, invent theories and legends which it would pay no useful man to either originate or contradict, and, by a combination of the wiles of the "unsophisticated child of the forest" with a smattering of lore picked up in the legislative library at Fredericton, make for himself a reputation, which, after all, is due much more to the proverbial kind-heartedness and tolerance of publishers than the merits of anything he has ever given to the public. This was true of him in his best days, and it is doubly so now. The press of the province, generally, has justly discouraged him of late, for the majority of publishers know that he seldom comes out of the woods of private life into the civilized precincts of the newspaper office save with the ulterior purpose in view of promoting some scheme for his own benefit, or revenging himself upon someone whom he has found ahead to be taken advantage of. When Mr. Jack writes to the press concerning any particular fishing river of the province, you may be sure that he has had matters connected therewith so arranged that if any big American or Canadian fish-bait the "Jack bait" he will land in the spacious bag-net of the great C. E. If a letter appears disabusing the public mind of the idea that a certain river is as attractive to anglers as some people have intimated it was, put it down as probable that "some people" have not been disposed to meet the views of a certain well-advised authority on such subjects, in the matter of "letting him in" on his own usual terms as a shareholder and "promoter." If the announcement be made on the authority of Mr. Edward Jack, C. E., that a terra incognita, through which a certain river runs, has hundreds of millions of first class spruce upon it, take it for granted that the story is empty as bait by which the great explorer is attempting to secure for himself charge of an expedition to the region in question at the expense of some other lumber speculator, although it is not at all improbable that by some process of which the explorer professes to know nothing, a third party may be let into the business just as the time arrives when practical advantage is to materialize. Mr. Jack's methods are so well understood.
