LABOR LEADERS FIGHT SOLDIERS. More Bloodshed in Western Miners' Strike. Secretary Haywood, of the Western Federation of Miners, Bayoneted by Soldiers in Denver.

DENVER, Colo., April 21.—When the train bearing Charles H. Meyer, president of the Western Federation of Miners, who is to appear this afternoon before the superior court for a hearing on habeas corpus proceedings, arrived today, accompanied by a military guard, a general fight followed.

FELL NEARLY A MILE. Terrible Accident in Silver Mine—Twelve Miners Instantly Killed by Breaking of Cable.

MEXICO CITY, April 21.—A telegram received here from Capucha, the capital of the state of Hidalgo, stating that a mine disaster occurred in which twelve miners lost their lives by being precipitated to the bottom of a shaft, 350 metres deep.
