AN EXECUTION PARTY

Several Guests in Evening Dress, While Headsman Wore Pair of White

BERLIN, Dec. 20—Rudolf Hennig, the daring murderer who made a sen-sational escape from the clutches of the

sational escape from the clutches of the Kaiser's police and was subsequently recaptured after a pitched battle in the streets of Stettin, was beheaded in Berlin a few days ago upon the anniversary of his crime. The execution took place in the presence of a select company of invited guests, some of whom were clad in evening dress. These latter included the headsman, Herr Schweitz, of Breslau, who also wore white gloves.

Shouting incoherent curses, the murderer was thrown violently to his knees by the executioner's three muscular assistants, who placed his head squarely in the centre of the block. Having placed the death warrant bearing the Kaiser's signature in his wallet, the executioner swung his glistening axe, and Hennig's head was cleanly severed with a well-directed blow.

yesterday that he would begin a cru-sade for better conditions in the school buildings that the eyes of pupils might not be harmed. One thing which inspired Mr. Ritter in his action is the injury to her eyes which his little daughter has sustained since she began her studies.

"Occulists I have consulted," said President Ritter, "tell me their business with schoolchildren is on the increase. Persons acquainted with the details of school affairs know that we have employed an expert on lighting of schoolrooms to instruct the teachers. 


