PROTESTANTS IN FRANCE.—According to a statement published by the *Monitor*, the two Reformed Churches in France possessed, in 1840, 464 pastors; in 1843, 677; and in 1845, upwards of 700. The budget of the Protestant Church amounted, under the empire, to 300,000fr.; under the Restoration, to 675,000fr.; and, in 1844, to 1,219,000fr. The number of temples had likewise increased; but there are still 111 localities without any places of worship. There is in France, a Protestant population of about 4,000,000.
