Great additions to the tonnage trad-

000 registered tons in excess of ton-
nage now plying regularly in establish-
ed lines to this port without consider-
ing the additions being made to the
tonnage of the coastwise fleet. The
two new C. P. R. liners, the Empress
of Asia and Empress of Russia, tur-
bine driven steamers to be added
about 12 months hence to the trans-
Pacific service of this company are
