

LICENSING OF CHAUFFEURS

Any person operating a motor vehi-
cle as a chauffeur is required under
an amendment passed at the last ses-
sion of the Legislature to the Motor
Vehicle Act to undergo an examina-
tion in order to obtain a certificate of
competency.
The undersigned has been authoriz-
ed by the Hon. P. J. Veniot, Minister
of Public Works, to examine all ap-
plicants for a chauffeur's license and to
issue certificates of competency which
must be forwarded to the Department
of Public Works. All parties desiring
