The Sub-Executive Meeting.

The Provincial Sub-Executive met in Toronto, February 15th, 16th and 17th. Present, Mrs. Thornley, Mrs. Cavers, Mrs. Wiley aud Mrs. Wright. The first meeting opened Thursday morning at 9:30 o'clock. The opening exercises were conducted by the President, Mrs. Thornley, each member present leading in earnest prayer for guidance and direction, and each feeling keenly the absence of her who had ever rendered such practical aid in the deliberations of the Sub-Executive.

The first question taken up was the vacant treasurship. Different names were suggested and discussed but no definite decision arrived at.

The financial condition of the late Treasurer's books was considered. They were found to be in a most satisfactory state.

Mrs. Cavers, acting Treasurer, laid before the Executive a number of bills which, upon examination, were ordered to be paid.

The Committee then adjourned to assemble again at 2:30 o'clock.

Mrs. Urquhart, representing the department of Legislation and Petition, was the first introduced. After a general discussion, an outline of the work necessary to be taken up by the Superintendent was arranged.

Mrs. Mason, Superintendent of Hygiene and Heredity, succeeded Mrs. Urquhart, and various methods of work were projected to further the interests of this Department.

Mrs. Wrigley, representing the department of Temperance in Sabbath Schools, followed. It was decided that sample copies of a Sunday School Temperance leaflet be printed and in sufficient numbers to supply every delegate at the next Provincial Convention with a copy. It was also suggested that throughout the year Mrs. Wrigley communicate with those interested in Sunday School work, re the introduction of the White Ribbon Army
