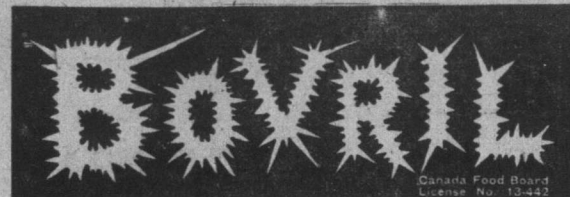

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Says Line Necessary to Frontier. Robert Hobson, of Hamilton, a member of the Canadian National Railway Commission, was asked to-day if the C.N.R. was considering the matter of building a line from Toronto to Niagara. He said the question was under consideration. A line would have to be built to the frontier, said Mr. Hobson, but whether in the near or distant future he could not say.

Guelph's Dividend. The city of Guelph has every reason to feel a great deal of pride in the fact that a number of years ago she built the Guelph Junction Railway, sixteen miles of road running between the city and Guelph Junction on the main line of the C.P.R., for it has proved an investment of which few cities, if any, can boast. The annual meeting of the company was held when another dividend was declared on the \$170,000 worth of stock owned by the city, amounting to 10 1/2 per cent., or \$18,404.58. This makes a grand total for the year of \$27,375 or 33 per cent. on the investment. This breaks all previous records. In addition to this \$94,904 was paid in taxes to the city. The election of officers resulted as follows: Pres., J. W. Lyon; Vice-Pres., Mayor J. E. Carter; Sec.-Treas., Col. A. H. Macdonald; Business Manager, T. E. Savage.
