they may desire to have elected, when a ballot shall be taken and the person or persons, as the case may be, having the highest number of votes, shall be deemed duly elected ;—a certificate of such election shall be given, signed by the Chairman and Secretary, to the succe-sful candidate or 5 candidates, and the minutes of the meeting itself, certified by the Chairman and Secretary, shall be forwarded to the President of the Corporation. The Chairman shall be entitled to a vote in the event of a tie only. Ties. Each voter shall have the right of voting for the whole number of Fel- Votes. lows to be returned for that division.
