A Bill of an urgent nature is passed with unusual expedition, 42. Clauses—may be reconsidered at any time previous to the passing of a Bill, 44. Supply Bills—admit of no irrelevant clauses, 48. Money Bills—must be recommended by the Queen's Representative, 47. Bills originating and passed in the Senate cannot be again introduced in the same Session, 46.
