The records show that consultations are being carried on at the rate of approximately 2000 yearly.	
	30-8-42		Prospective members of the local Air Cadet Squadron are seen about twice monthly in cooperation with the squadron medical officer, who is not equipped to carry out certain of the tests, such as those for colour vision. These examinations are done in the evening and do not conflict with routine work.	
	31-8-42		Course 61, just commencing training, found to be composed largely of airmen who have attended the pre-aircrew Training School at Quebec. The progress of this course will be of special interest to the Maths. Section. Application for write-off concerning the shortage of 300 sheets and 355 pillow slips was submitted to No. 1 Training Command. These shortages represent the only deficiencies in equipment found in the stocks of the Section and No. 1 Training Command was advised accordingly. Incoming shipments of equipment included such items as steam traps and spare parts for Link Trainers. Course No. 61 commenced training with a strength of 110. Squadron Leader Rogers from No. 1 Training Command paid a visit to the Station.
