Flight Lieutenant A.E.L. Caulfield, the Protestant Chaplain, conducted the service. Flying Officer C.H.E. Gilbert was in charge of the funeral party. Buried in South Grave, Block 73, Lot 1.  Heavy fog and extremely mild weather prevailed all day. Snow completely gone.
