could be transferred there. The sorting, for example, for the several rural mail delivery routes could be done at Waterloo instead of at Berlin. This would help to reduce the agitation which is being made in Berlin at the present timefor the enlargment of the existing premises.

Knowing how desirous the Minister of Finance is to restrict expenditures, I would not press this matter immediately, unless it were one which should have been attended to years ago, and unless I felt quite sure that there were no localities more deserving from the point of view of need.
