
## Representation in Industry:

Positive co-operation for industrial progress will be seen to rest on an appreciation of industry as a social service, carrying with it a right of all to progressively share in advance of industry and representation of all who participate, in the control of general policy. This is a question of status.



The organization of industry on a trust basis is almost identical with that of an industry on a national basis. To assume that in the government of the trust there is any more of the human agent than in the government of municipal tramways is the veriest nonsense. The only real difference is that under one the community, either as consumers, ratepayers, or tax-payers, receive first consideration, while under the trust scheme the capitalist's interest is paramount.
