Visit to Pagan Falls
and Gatineau Mill.

August 5th., 1932.

9.30 a.m.

Leave Chateau Laurier by bus, provided by the courtesy of the Gatineau Power Company. (The busses will leave the main entrance of the hotel on Wellington St; they are marked "Gatineau Bus Company, Limited" and are painted red.)

The party will proceed over the Interprovincial Bridge to the city of Hull. Pausing for a few minutes at the City Hall Square, a welcome will be given by the Hull Boy Scouts and the band of the Regiment de Hull.

9.45.

Leave Hull.

11.00 a.m.

Arrive Pagan Falls and inspect the Hydro-Electric plant of the Gatineau Power Company until 12.30 p.m.

This plant has a designed capacity of 272,000 horsepower in 8 generating units of 34,000 horsepower each; 7 of these are now in operation. From this power plant the largest transmission line in the British Empire transmits power to Toronto. The line is 230 miles long, and the voltage is 220,000 volts.

The operation of river-driving the logs used for paper making will be seen.

Lunch in Powerhouse.

1.30 p.m.

Leave Pagan Falls.

3.30 p.m.

Arrive Gatineau Paper Mill. This is one of the largest newsprint mills in Canada, having a capacity of 650 tons of newsprint per day. It is owned and operated by the Canadian International Paper Company. The complete operation of transforming wood into newsprint will be seen. The 4 largest machines in the world are in operation in this mill, each having a daily capacity of 150 tons.
