

covered by Treaty 6 was allowed,
 the difficulties which might arise
 owing to their residence within
 the premises of another Treaty
 than that to which they belong
 were fully understood, it was
 thought better to give the Indian
 members of this Band an offering
 for improvement rather than to
 keep them on their old reserve
 which was unsuitable for
 agriculture. These Indians
 are still adherent of the
 No. 5 no matter where they
 reside and everything given
 to them under Treaty stipulations
 should conform to the provisions
 of that Treaty. I would be
