Ottawa, 17th December, 1912.

SIR:-

I am in receipt of your letter of the 2nd instant, with which you enclosed a requisition for wood, coal oil etc. for use in your office and also for use by the constable, and in reply I beg to say that the articles which you have asked for for yourself may be purchased. No provision has been made for the supply of the articles asked for for the constable, and you should not have taken for granted that they would be supplied. The Constable is paid salary at the rate of \$75.00 a month, and is entitled to moities of liquor fines, and also to his actual travelling expenses. He should provide his own fuel and light. As his duty calls him out amongst the Indians the greater part of the time, his expenses in this connection should not be large.
