His Majesty having been graciously
pleased to declare and enjoin by Proclamation, given
at his court at St. James's the seventh day of
October One Thousand seven hundred and sixty three;
that the Trade with the Indians shall be free and
open to all his Subjects whatever.

In Obedience whereunto this Licence is given unto
to pass unmolested
with one canoe, manned with men
whose names, occupations and place of abode,
and also the quantity of Merchandise on board, are
reported upon oath, and specified in the Margin,
to such markets or parts, as he shall find most
advantageous for the disposal of the said Merchandise

Quantity and Quality
of Merchandise. Sent

Gallons of spirituous liquors

Tools

hand. w. Gunpowder

hand. w. Shot & balls

and

Staves and Casks for other

Merchandise, in all

amounting to the sum of

Pounds lawful money of

the said Province, or

thereabouts, upon oath

Provided always that such places are
not prohibited by the Regulations his Majesty
has been pleased to give, by him self, or by the
Superintendants or Commissioners by him
appointed to direct the Indian Trade; the
said
having given bond to observe and pay due
obedience thereto.
