A. Yes, sir.

Q. So you transferred over your business and your business connections party, figuring it would be beneficial?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. How long did you remain in partnership?

A. Till around the first of December.

Q. Three or four months?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Where did your wife and family live at that time?

A. In the same house.

Q. They lived in the auto camp?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Were you able to replenish this furniture you had to sell?

Yes, sir.

Q. What would you assume your earnings to be at that time?

A. About 250 dollars per month.

Q. Were you able to save any?

A. Not very much.

Q. What did you do after that?

A. This truck kept breaking down so I sold it. I got the money back that I put into it. We moved into coden, Alberta and rented this rooming house there. I went to work driving for a lumber company, the Storess Lumber company.

Q. How long did you remain with the Storess Lumber Company?

A. While I was hauling lumber with my own truck for the company. When I had my own car I was hauling my own props for the Storess Lumber Company. Then I went to work and drove one of the lumber company trucks.

Then what did you do?

A. I drove the lumber company truck and then I got my army call.

Q. At what time was that? Can you give me a date?

A. It was sometime just after Christmas, sir, in January of 1943 I believe.
