

Fellow Craft, A plain white Lamb skin, similar to that of the Entered Apprentice, with the addition only of two sky blue rosettes at the bottom.

Master Mason, The same with sky blue lining and edging one and a half inch deep, and an additional rosette in the fall or flap, and silver tassels. No other color or ornament shall be allowed, except to Officers and Past Officers of Lodges, who may have the emblems of their offices in silver, or white in the centre of the Apron.

Masters and Past Masters of Lodges to wear in lieu and in the places of the three rosettes on the Master Mason's apron, perpendicular lines upon horizontal lines, thereby forming three several sets of two right angles; the length of the horizontal lines to be two inches and half each, and of the perpendicular lines one inch: these Emblems to be of ribbon half an inch broad, and of the same color as the lining and edging of the Apron.

The Master is responsible for the due observance of the Laws relating to private Lodges, and must produce all books, minutes, and accounts, when required by any lawful authority.

The Wardens or officers of a Lodge cannot be removed by the Master, except by consent of the Lodge after investigation of the cause of complaint against them.

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
