ANNUAL MEETING.

The Secretary read a list of nominations for Directors, by the Board.

On motion of Mr. Chas. Cushing, seconded by Rev. W. T. Gunn, the Secretary was instructed to cast a ballot for the gentlemen named; which was done, and the following were declared by the President to be duly elected, viz.:

The suggested change in name of paper to "Canadian Congregationalist" was stated by the President to the meeting, and informally and unanimously carried.
