



GOSSIP.

Messrs. Innis & Horton, of Clinton, Ont., have recently purchased the famous trotting stallion, Texas Jack, from Mr. L. Wigle, Leamington, Ont. He is a horse of wonderful speed and a roadster-producing sire that has seldom, if ever, been surpassed. He is nicely settled in his new home.

George Rice, Currie's Crossing, Ont., reports the sale of the following Holstein cattle: The 2-year-old bull advertised in last issue of the ADVOCATE, to Mr. J. W. VanDyck, Conway, Ont. Mr. Abram Rowand secured a fine bull calf from the great sire, Homestead Albino DeKol; and to Mr. Andrew Boa, Lachute, Quebec, was shipped a fine heifer calf from the same sire; also a 5-month-old bull calf, whose dam is Isoco Pride. Her udder measures 5 ft. 8 in. around when fresh, and she is full sister to Woodland Isoco, that won 2nd in the London test after being in milk 15 days. She is now in the Brookbank herd, along with many other public-test winners. Mr. Thomas B. Carlaw, Warkworth, Ont., ordered a fine bull to head his herd. Enquiries are pouring in from all over. Far-off Newfoundland has just been heard from.

On page 245 of this issue Jas. I. Davidson & Son offer for sale the 4-year-old Clydesdale stallion, Toffy Superior (2252), which they describe as a large, smooth horse, with short legs, heavy body, and good action; was exhibited seven times and never beaten. His sire, Toffy (Imp.) 2123 (9452), was a prizewinner in every competition at the leading shows in Canada, including gold medal at Ottawa. His dam, Kate Hill 2nd, was the winner of twelve first prizes, several sweepstakes, and gold medal, winning sweepstakes for best mare and two of her progeny at the Toronto Industrial, progeny being Toffy Superior and full brother, Pride of Balsam. Her dam, (Imp) Kate Hill, was a prizewinner whenever shown; a superior mare, her sire being young Surprise (1094), who was awarded 3rd prize at the Agricultural Society Show at Glasgow. Toffy Superior's grand sire, Lowie Gordon, was the winner of twelve 1st prizes. He was also awarded the 1st prize at the Industrial, Toronto, as the sire of the best 5 Clydesdales of either sex under 3 years old. Intending purchasers will not be disappointed when they see him.

THE BIRMINGHAM SHORTHORN SHOW AND SALE.

At the English show and sale of Shorthorn bulls at Birmingham, March 7th, the first day's offerings made prices far in advance of those made at the Scotch spring sales, 175 bulls averaging \$46, and Mr. R. H. Dyke's Duke of Barrington 53rd, a Bates-bred bull, with a dash of Scotch through Western Lad, making the great price of 510 guineas, or \$2,625. He was the first prize winner in the class for bulls over 10 and not exceeding 30 months, known as the £50 class on account of the handsome prize money offered by the Society. The purchaser was Mr. Miller, for South America. Mr. J. Gowing's Cock of the North, first prize in class over 15 and under 18 months, was the second highest priced bull, going at 250 guineas to Mr. Miller. Mr. J. W. Barrow's Masterpiece, the fifth prize winner in the class over 21 months and under 30 months, was the next highest priced bull, going at 250 guineas to Mr. MacLennan, for Buenos Ayres. Lord Lovat's second prize calf in the young class, Encombe, went to Mr. Miller at 210 guineas. Nine others brought from 100 guineas to 205 guineas each.

MR. WM. WYLIE'S AYRSHIRES.

Prominent among the best herds of Ayrshires in the Province is that of Mr. Wm. Wylie, of Howick, P. Q. This herd stood well to the front in the leading exhibitions—Toronto, London, and Ottawa—last season (1899), having won in all prizes, 17 of them being firsts, and also won first and diploma for best herd of Ayrshires at the Western Fair, London, and first and gold medal for herd at Central Canada Fair, Ottawa; also sweepstakes for best female at Ottawa, and silver medal for best bull of any age at Toronto. The herd is of a uniform type and style, specially bred for heavy milkers and stylish animals, with deep bodies and good constitution, the right sort for the dairy, a fact which proves itself from the large quantities of milk that is shipped daily by rail from the farm at Howick to Montreal. The imported heifer, White Rose of Langside, dropped a heifer calf in the latter end of December, and is doing exceedingly well. She was never shown in Canada, but was a prizewinner as a yearling in Scotland. Lady Kelpie No. "7688" also dropped a heifer calf a few days ago. This is one of the best cows in the herd; she has been a prizewinner wherever shown. It was the intention to show her in the herd last fall, but her not proving to be in calf at the right time, another was shown in her place. She has a perfect-shaped udder and good teats, and is giving over 40 lbs. of milk per day and only about a week calved, and not being fed very high for fear of milk fever. She has never been shown since she was a 2-year-old, and she then stood second at Montreal, first at Sherbrooke, and first at Ottawa in a very strong competition. The imported 3-year-old heifer, Polly of Burnbrae, has improved wonderfully since going into winter feeding. She is due to calve in May next to the young imported bull, Duke of Clarence of Barcheskie, the sweepstakes winner at Ottawa last September. The herd is in prime condition, numbers about 30 head, and by competent judges is pronounced to be one of the most even lots to be found in the Province. The cows are all in calf to the imported bulls, Scotland's Glory and Duke of Clarence of Barcheskie. Anyone requiring new blood to improve their stock would do well to inspect this herd. The young heifer calf of Nellie Osborne 2nd is a great favorite. She is called Nellie Osborne 4th, and is most likely to keep up the reputation of her dam and granddam. Among the sales that have recently been made are: One yearling bull to Mr. D. Cook, Bainsville, Ont.; one bull calf to Messrs. E.
