4th. That the principal fums of the faid Army Bills of Twenty-five Dollars each and upwards, fhould, at the option of the Commander of the Forces, be payable on demand to the holders of fuch Army Bills in Cafh, or in Government Bills of Exchange, in London, at Thirty Days Sight, at the current rate of Exchange.

5th. That the Interest of all such Army Bills, of Twenty-five Dollars each and upwards, upon the payment thereof in Cash, or in Bills of Exchange as aforefaid, should be paid in Army Bills, or in Cash, at the Army Bill Office, at the option of the holders of such Army Bills.

6th. That the principal fums of all fuch Army Bills of Twenty five Dollars each, and upwards, if paid Cafh, fhould be paid at the Army Bill Office Office, but if paid in Government Bills of Exchange, fhould be paid at the Office of the Commiffary General, upon a depofit in Army Bills of the amount of the Bills of Exchange to be fo paid, and a certificate of fuch deposit under the hand of the Superintendant of the Army Bill Office, to the Commission General.

7th. That it will be adviseable for His Excellency the Governor, as Commander of the Forces, from time to time, to prepare and make, or cause to be prepared and made, such number of Army Bills of the value of Four Dollars each, as he shall see fit. Provided the faid Army Bills of Four Dollars each, and the faid Army Bills of Twenty-five Dollars each and upwards, do not together exceed the aforefaid sum of Two hundred and fifty thousand pounds Currency.

8th. That the faid Army Bills of Four Dollars each, fhould be payable at the Army Bill Office in Cafh, to the Bearer, on demand.

oth. That all Army Bills whatever, fhould be iffued as Cafh, upon the warrants of His Excellency the Commander of the Forces, to fuch perfon or perfons, as he, by fuch warrants, fhall fee fit to direct fuch payments to be made.

10th. That the current rate of Exchange thould be established on Oath,
