prefented a Bill for the better preventing the Introduction and fpreading of contagious Discompensive the Province of Nova-Scotia, and the fame was read a first Time. Refolved, That the Bill be read a fecond time.

A Petition of Nathaniel Parker, Foster Woodberry, and others, Inhabitants of the Township of Wilmot, and of the Eastern Part of the Township of Annapolis, was prefented by Mr. Millidge, and read setting forth. That the Petitioners at a very confiderable Expence have cut a Road from the Nistaur Falls in the Township of Annapolis, to meet a Road cut by the Inhabitants of Liverpool. half way to the faid Falls from the Town of Liverpool. That the faid Road will be of great public Utility, and praying the House will grant such Aid for improving and compleating the fame, as to them may seem fit:

Ordered, I hat the Petition do lie on the Table.

Mr. Solicitor General purfuant to leave given, prefented, a Bill to amend the Act for appointing Firewards, and afcertaining their Duty, and the fame was read a first Time. Refolved, That the Bill be read a fecond Time.

A Bill for fuppressing Unlicensed Houses, and for prescribing the manner of granting Licences, was read a fecond Time,

Referved, That the Bill be committed to a Committee of the whole Houfe.

A Message from the Council by Mr. Gautier, Mr. Speaker,

The Council have passed a Bill, intitled, an Ast to authorise the Sale or Exchange of Globe Lands in certain Cases, to which they defire the Concurrence of this House.

And then the Meffenger withdrew,

Ordered, That the faid Bill be read a first time To-morrow.

On Motion the House resolved itself into a Committee of the whole House, on the engrossed Bill from the Council, intitled, an Ast for the better Regulation of the Circuit Courts, and for granting new Trials in Causes brought up from Inferior Courts.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair,

Mr. Pool, took the Chair,

Mr. Speaker refumed the Chair,

The Chairman, reported from the Committee, that they had Confidered the Bill to them referred, and had come to two Refolutions thereupon, which they had directed him to report to the Houfe, and he read the Refolutions in his Place, and afterwards delivered them in at the Clerk's Table, where they were read, and are as follows;

Resolved, That it is the Opinion of this Committee, that the House should appoint a Committee to confer with his Majesty's Council, on the subject Matter of the said Bill;

Refolved, That it is the Opinion of this Committee that the Committee fo to be appointed to confer with the Council, fhould be infructed to flate to the Council the Propriety of eftablishing Courts of Nisi Prius throughout the Province, and to be a nearly as poffible on the principle of the Courts of Nisi Prius eftablished in England.

The faid Refolutions were again read, a first and second Time, and upon the Question severally put thereupon, agreed to by the House.

Ordered, That Mr. Solicitor General, Mr. Tonge, Mr. Millidge, Mr. Belcher, and Mr. Dewolf, be a Committee of Conference with the Council agreeable to the foregoing Refolutions, and that the Clerk do defire the fame.

The Order of the Day being read.

On Motion *refolved*, that this Houfe will To-morrow *refolve* itself into a Committee of the whole Houfe, to confider further of a Supply to be granted for the Support of his Majefty's Government.
