

*Resolved*, That the said Address be presented to His Excellency by a Committee of this House.

*Ordered*, That Mr. Archibald, Mr. Mortimer, Mr. Haliburton, Mr. Cogswell, Mr. Prescott, Mr. Bingay, and Mr. Ruggles, be a Committee for that purpose.

On motion, the House resolved itself into a committee of the whole House, to consider further of a Supply.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair,

Mr. James took the Chair,

Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair.

The Chairman reported from the Committee, that they had made some progress in the business to them referred; and had come to several Resolutions thereupon, which they had directed him to report to the House, and he read the same in his place, and afterwards delivered them in at the Clerk's Table, where they were read, and are as follow:—

*Resolved*, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that a sum of nineteen pounds five shillings and ten pence, should be granted to W. K. Reynolds & Co. for a Drawback of the Duties on 463 gallons of Rum, by them exported from the Port of Halifax, and landed on the Coast of Labrador, in the last year.

*Resolved*, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that a sum of sixty-two pounds fourteen shillings, should be granted and paid to H. H. Cogswell, Esq. being a Commission of three per cent. for expending the sum of £2090, in repairs on the Government House, in the years 1815, 1816, and 1817.

*Resolved*, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that a sum of twenty-five pounds should be granted to Lieut. Col. John MacColla, in full, for services performed by him as acting Adjutant-General of Militia.

*Resolved*, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that a sum of seventeen pounds ten shillings should be granted to Matthew Forrester, for his services as temporary Door-Keeper to the House of Assembly in the present Session.

*Resolved*, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that a sum of ninety pounds should be granted to open the Roads from Bowers's to the Welch Settlement, in the County of Shelburne; and to build a small Bridge to facilitate the passing to and from the said Settlement.

*Resolved*, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that a sum of one hundred pounds should be granted to the Clerk of the House of Assembly, to defray the expense of extra Clerks, Servants, and other incidental expenses during the present Session.

*Resolved*, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that a sum not exceeding twenty pounds should be granted to the Clerk of the House of Assembly, for defraying the expense of Stationary furnished for the use of the House of Assembly, and His Majesty's Council in the present Session.

*Resolved*, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that a sum of twenty-five pounds, should be granted to John Lawson, Jun. for his services, in drafting and copying Bills for the Members of the House of Assembly, in the present Session.

*Resolved*, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that a sum of one hundred and twenty-two pounds fifteen shillings should be granted to defray certain expenses incurred by order of His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, for the opening of Roads for the Settlement of disbanded Soldiers, in the last year, as communicated in His Excellency's Message to the House of Assembly, in the present Session.

*Resolved*, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that the Collector of Imposit and Excise, for the District of Halifax, be authorised and directed to pay the sum of £113 6 7 to the joint credit of Enos Collins, Joseph Allison, John Moody, Alexander Stewart and Joseph P. Boyle, upon their debt due to the King for Provincial Duties, being for the amount
