Mr. Chipman, Colonel Billopp and Mr. Stelle, are appointed Committee appointed. a Committee to bring in a bill for continuing and amending the act for laying an Impost.

Mr. Bliss, Captain Attwood, and Mr. Hubbard, are appointed a Committee to examine and report fuch laws as have expired or are near expiring.

The Speaker communicated to the House three letters receiters from the avent during the receis from Brook Watson, Esquire, Agent of the Province, and correspondence with him—which were with him communicated. read.

The House adjourned until two o'clock to-morrow.
