PRAYERS.

Mr. R. Simonds, Chairman of the Committee appointed to wait upon His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the Address upon the subject of exploring the proper lines for the Great Roads, reported that they had attended to that duty, and that His Excellency was pleased to make the following reply:

"I desire you will assure the House that I receive their Address with much satisfaction, and that I shall direct that such parts of their several grants for the Great Roads as may be necessary, shall be applied to the very important purpose of exploring ascertaining and establishing the most proper lines and directions for those Roads, before any part of the very liberal grants made by the House are laid out."

Mr. Smith, pursuant to leave, brought in a bill, "to appropriate a part of the Public Revenue to provide for the ordinary services of the Province." Which was read a first and second time.

And on motion the House resolved itself into a Committee of the whole, in consideration of the said bill.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair.

Mr. Smith took the Chair of the Committee.

Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair.

Mr. Smith, from the Committee, reported that they had gone into consideration of the bill referred to them, and had agreed to the same without making any amendment thereto.

Ordered that the Report be accepted, and the bill engrossed.

A Message from His Majesty's Council.

Mr. Black delivered the Message as follows:---

"Mr. Speaker,

"I am directed to inform this House that the Council have agreed to the following bills:

A bill "for the more effectual recovery of Fines imposed upon Jurors and Officers attending the Courts of Justice in this Province."

A bill, "to alter and amend the Laws now in force for the establishment, regulation and improvement of the Great Roads through the Province."

A bill "to continue and amend the Acts for raising a Revenue in this Province."

"And that the Council have agreed to the Resolutions of Appropriation dated 12th March, excepting that, re-appropriating £100 granted in the year 1816, for the erection of a Church at Clitham; and that granting £30 to the Trustees of Schools in the Parish of Sheffield, to rebuild a School House."

And then Mr. Black withdrew.
