

## CAP. IV.

An ACT to repeal certain Duties and Customs set forth in a certain Act passed in the Session of Parliament, holden in the Eighth and Ninth years of Her present Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to regulate the Trade of the British Possessions abroad," so far as the same relate to this Colony.

[Passed April 22, 1847.]

**W**HEREAS the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain, did by an Act passed on the Twenty-eighth day of August in the year of Our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and forty-six, intituled "An Act to enable the Legislatures of certain British Possessions, to reduce or repeal certain Duties of Customs," authorize and empower the several Colonial Legislatures to reduce or repeal, all or any of the Duties of Customs imposed by the Imperial Act passed in the Eighth and Ninth years of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to regulate the Trade of the British Possessions abroad." And whereas it would tend to facilitate Trade and Commerce between this Colony and other Countries, if the Duties imposed by the said Act were repealed: Be it therefore enacted, by the Lieutenant Governor, Council and Assembly, That on from and after the Fifth day of July next, or from such time thereafter, as the Royal assent shall be duly signified, to this Act, and Proclamation thereof made in the *Royal Gazette* Newspaper of this Colony, all Duties of Customs imposed by the said Imperial Act passed in the Eighth and Ninth years of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to regulate the Trade of the British Possessions abroad, in so far as the same relate to this Colony," shall be, and they are hereby wholly repealed.

Repeals duties of Customs relating to this Colony, imposed by Imperial Act of the 8th and 9th Victoria, Cap. 93, after 5th July next, or from such time thereafter, as Royal assent be signified to this Act, and notified in *Royal Gazette* Newspaper of this Colony.
