THE sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a luarter-section of available Dominion land n Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Ap-plicant must appear in person at the Do-ninion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for he District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions. Duties—Six months' residence upon and ultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within ine miles of his homestead on a farm of the last 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity. In certain districts a homesteader in 3rd Jr .-- Verna Rush, Merton Penny, and-Wilfred Malcolm. 1st-Walter Knowles, Marshall Dean, Bell Bradley, Edna Swayze,

In certain districts a homesteader in good stauding may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Six months' residence in each of three years after earning homestead pat-ent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon is homestead patent, on certain conditions. A settler who has exhausted his home-stead right may take a purchased home-


